Free Things to Do in Maui County

Maui

1. **TEDESCHI VINEYARD.** If you're into wine, take a tour of the Tedeschi Vineyard. Tasting room open to the public 7 days a week from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Tours at 10:30 a.m., 1:30 p.m. and 3:00 p.m. 808-878-6058.
2. **HAWAIIAN ISLANDS HUMPBACK WHALE NATIONAL MARINE SANCTUARY.** Brilliantly displayed with murals of undersea life, the center offers educational displays, artifacts, reading and video materials on the Humpback Whales and their habitat. Lectures and free educational materials. Open Monday to Friday, 10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. 808-879-2818.
3. **HALE PA'AHAO.** Lāhainā's prison from the whaling days of the 1800's. Hale Pa'ahao was built from coral stone from a demolished waterfront fort. It was quite crowded in its time and still has the wall shackles and ball and chain restraints for you to see. Open Monday to Friday, 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. 808-667-1985.
4. **HALE PA'I.** The printing house of Lahainaluna Seminary, founded in 1831, was restored in 1980. A free exhibit features a replica of the original rampage press and facsimiles of early printings. Open Monday to Friday, 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. 808-667-7040.
5. **ART NIGHT.** Friday night is Art Night in Lāhainā. Browse the galleries and meet the artists. There are some world-class pieces to be seen so do some window-shopping. It's free only if you don't buy anything! Many of the galleries offer light refreshments. Discover the character of Lāhainā in the cool of the night.
6. **SNORKELING.** Not all snorkeling is done by boat. Drive to either Honolua Bay on the upper west side or to La Perouse Bay on the south side. But please do your part to protect these precious areas: Take all trash out with you. Do not stand on the coral. Never take anything out of the preserve unless you or someone else took it there.
7. **WHALE WATCHING.** When the humpback whales are wintering in Maui waters, you can see them just about everywhere you look. Some of the better viewing locations from shore would be at either the scenic lookout along the Honoapi'ilani Highway or on the cliffs over looking Honolua Bay.
8. **THE ROAD TO HĀNA.** It is not so much the destination that counts on this trip as it is the scenery on the way. The east side of Maui is what you really picture Hawai'i to be. Pack a big lunch; stop at as many waterfalls and pools as you can. Flower and fruit stands, Wai'ānapanapa State Park and 'Ohe'ō are only some of the many highlights.
9. **MĀKENA BEACH.** One of the largest beaches on the island and the last major undeveloped beach on Maui's south side. This beach is so precious that the County of Maui has purchased the surrounding land to keep it undeveloped. Locals and visitors enjoy the soft white sand and crystal blue waters.
10. **HO'OKIPA BEACH PARK.** If your timing is right you will get to see some the world's top professional windsurfers in action. Considered to be the windsurfing capital of the world, Ho'okipa Beach Park attracts windsurfers from around the world who fly at speeds up to 30 mph and jump distances of over 30 feet.

11. **ĪAO VALLEY.** This is one of the easiest hikes on the island. The paved walkway takes you to the incredible Īao Needle. For the more adventurous, continue up the stream to some nice pools for a quick dip.
12. **LĀHAINĀ TOWN.** Lāhainā used to be a whaling town and it is certainly unique. There are numerous historical sites and shopping opportunities. Art Night on Front Street every Friday is free and sponsored by the Lahaina Arts Society.
13. **MAUI ARTS AND CULTURAL CENTER.** Performing arts complex featuring free art exhibits of various types year round. The 1,100 seat theatre and 5,000 seat amphitheatre have ticketed events.
14. **LĀHAINĀ WHALING CENTER.** Lawless days and ways from the whaling era revived through artifacts.
15. **HALEKI'Ī-PIHANA HEIAU.** In Wailuku at end of Hea Place (off Kūhiō Place from Waiehu Beach Road on Highway 340). 10 acres protecting the remains of two historical and cultural *heiau* (temples) used as war temples. Good views of central Maui.
16. **BANYAN TREE PARK.** Lāhainā at the beginning of Front Street. You've never seen a tree like this before; it is so big it shades almost an entire acre of land.
17. **FREE ENTERTAINMENT AND HULA SHOWS:**
 - Kā'anapali Beach Hotel.** Hawaiian music and *hula* performed nightly in the courtyard.
 - Whalers Village.** Monday, Wednesday and Saturday, 7:00 p.m.-8:00 p.m. at center stage. 808-661-4567. Live entertainment.
 - Lāhainā Cannery Mall.** Tuesday and Thursday, 7:00 p.m. at center stage. 808-661-5304. *Hula* show.
18. **'UKULELE LESSONS.** Lāhainā Cannery Mall center stage, Tuesdays. 808-661.5304.
19. **LEGENDS OF KĀ'ANAPALI.** 90-minute, cultural journey highlighting the town's folklore. Some walking is required. Tuesdays and Fridays, 9:00-11:00 a.m. 22 people limit per tour. 808-661-3271 for reservation and information.
20. **LEI-MAKING CLASS.** Whalers Village lower level center stage, Tuesday, 11:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m.; Friday, 12:00 to 2:00 p.m.
21. **WHALERS VILLAGE WHALING MUSEUM AND FILMS.** Whalers Village upper level. Museum takes you back in time to the heyday of Lāhainā's whaling industry, from 1825-1860. Learn about marine life. Films run from 9:00 a.m.- 8:30 p.m.
22. **HAWAIIAN OUTRIGGER CANOE RIDES.** The Fairmont Kea Lani provides a 45-minute excursion on a Hawaiian outrigger canoe that include stories, myths and legends of Maui as well as how the Hawaiians used the stars for navigation. Monday, Wednesday and Friday beginning at 7:00 a.m. Reservations are required 808-665-4386.

1. **WATCH THE SUNRISE** from Hulopoʻe Point, facing Puʻu-Pehe.
2. **WATCH THE SUNSET** from the lanai at the Four Seasons Resort Lānaʻi, The Lodge at Kōʻele.
3. **MAKE A NEW HORSE-FRIEND** at the Stables at Kōʻele fence line.
4. **SNORKEL IN HULOPOʻE BAY** and wonder at all the marine life.
5. **LĀNAʻI CULTURE & HERITAGE CENTER** to learn about Lānaʻi 's unique history.
6. **WALK LĀNAʻI CITY'S TOWN SQUARE.**
7. **HIKE THE MUNRO TRAIL** and catch breathtaking views of Lānaʻi, Molokaʻi and Maui.

1. **NA KAPUNA ENTERTAINMENT** in the Hula Shores Restaurant at Hotel Molokaʻi every Friday afternoon, 4:00-6:00 p.m.
2. **NA ʻOHANA HOALOHA** entertainment at Coffees of Hawaiʻi in Kualapuʻu every Sunday afternoon, 4:00-6:00 p.m.
3. **FARMER'S MARKET** in front of Bank of Hawaiʻi/American Savings every Saturday morning, 7:30 a.m.-12:00 p.m. You may purchase fruits and vegetables and original crafts by Molokaʻi artisans.
4. **PURDY'S MACADAMIA NUT FARM** in Kualapuʻu. Na Kapuna entertainment in the Hula Shores Restaurant at Hotel Molokaʻi every Friday afternoon, 4:00-6:00 p.m.
