Hotel del Coronado

Back by popular demand, the NGFA meets again in 2011 at the historic Hotel

del Coronado. Located on fashionable Coronado Island, The Del (as it's referred to by those "in the know") was built in 1888. The entire Coronado peninsula was purchased for \$110,000 by two developers who dreamed of building a hotel that would be "the talk of the Western world." Billed as the "World's Largest Free-Standing Wooden Structure," The Del has been a favorite of dignitaries – Lyndon Johnson and every president since have visited. And show-business figures, such as Frank Sinatra and Marilyn Monroe, brought cachet to The Del while filming there. A recent \$50 million restoration ensures that The Del will remain "the talk of the Western world" for years to come.

Sunday, March 13


The Country Elevator Committee and Finance and Administration Committee will co-host an Open Forum on "Financing and Capital Availability for 2011." A panel discussion will delve into the current market situation of high commodity prices and huge borrowing needs. How well are lenders positioned to respond? What are lenders looking for from their customers? How does the financial situation in the production sector impact agribusiness? And what can grain hedgers do to avoid common financing pitfalls? An all-star panel includes **Bob Egerton**, eastern regional president, CoBank; Elizabeth Hund, senior vice president, USBank; Doug Stark, Farm Credit Services of America; and Michael Stewart, Faegre & Benson LP.

The Rail Shipper/Receiver Committee will host a second Open Forum featuring Dan Elliott, chairman of the federal Surface Transportation Board, who will speak on national rail policy issues. In addition, John Gray, senior vice president, Association of American Railroads, will discuss Positive Train Control technology from a railroad perspective.

The carrier has been converted into a multi-dimensional, interactive, educational and entertainment complex, and is America's most-visited floating ship museum. Balboa Park Experience: Spend the afternoon exploring the lush grounds of beautiful and historic Balboa Park, an architectural wonderland that was home to two world expositions and more than 15 museums. Begin your afternoon with a guided tour of the park for an overview of all it has to offer. Then, use your Balboa Park Passport for admission to four museums of your choice, including the Aerospace Museum, San Diego Museum of Art, the Old Globe Theatre, the Natural History Museum, and the Museum of Man.
