From our earliest years, NGFF has fostered the highest standards in education pertinent to the industry. Our curriculum and training tools educate industry members on employee and workplace safety, food NGFF works to uplift the industry's visibility and reputation. We enhance **public education** about issues important to agribusiness—such as inland waterway transportation and feed safety—and promote a positive image of the grain, feed, and processing industry. The Foundation educates policy makers and the general public on the grain-based food system, ensuring the viability of our agricultural industry for generations to come.

Our **student scholarships** help prepare, support, and empower the next generation of promising leaders as they pursue careers in agriculture.

Discovering Their Future in Agriculture

Since 2021, the Foundation has partnered with the Minorities in Agriculture, Natural Resources and Related Sciences (MANRRS) national society to provide competitive scholarships to exceptional undergraduate and graduate students pursuing careers in agriculture or a closely related field. In addition to financial support, the scholarship provides networking and mentorship opportunities for the selected student scholars at the National Grain and Feed Association's yearly convention and annual Summer Legislative Fly-In. Scholars have gone to work with several NGFA member companies.

Promoting industry safety is paramount. NGFF's continuing education and workforce development efforts nurture a healthy, safe, and successful work environment. Our interactive training modules and hazard-assessment tools help mitigate risks and ensure best safety practices to protect employees. The Foundation's regional safety seminars provide ongoing safety education for grain handlers and processors across the country.

In an effort to anticipate and respond to the needs affecting our industry, the Foundation invests in research projects each year. We support both applied and original research efforts that enhance economic growth, fuel productivity, and expand the knowledge base of the industry. Critical research topics have included engulfment safety and prevention, biofuels, grain dust emissions, infectious diseases affecting livestock, and more.

Experience and exposure are two essential components lacking today for future agriculturalists. When people think of agriculture, they typically envision fruits and vegetables or spending all day in the fields. A Legacy For Fire & Explosion Research

Since the early 1980s, the Foundation has funded extensive education and research to prevent grain facility explosions. These efforts have helped lead to a dramatic reduction in the number of fire and explosion incidents at commercial grain-handling facilities. In conjunction with Purdue University, NGFF funds annual reports on grain facility explosions. These reports provide critical information and awareness to prevent these kinds of accidents. Accident prevention remains a major focus of the Foundation, which houses the resources of the National Grain and Feed Association's **Fire and Explosion Research Council**.
